The purpose of this program is to provide an opportunity for the residents of Cuyahoga County to actively participate in resolving air quality issues.

This project allows residents to collect air samples with a vacuum canister. The sample will then be analyzed at an Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) laboratory and the results may aid in determining sources of air pollution.
