- Assistance for cremation are reviewed on a case-by-case basis for City of Cleveland residents only. Persons with adequate alternative sources of funds for cremation are not eligible. The City of Cleveland deems alternative sources of funds as personal funds of the deceased, assets which can be sold to pay for services or other government agencies such as:
- Veteran's Benefits, including, but not limited to, funds for from the Department of Veterans Affairs and /or The Veterans Service Commission of Cuyahoga County.
- Direct Cremation
- Ashes are returned to the family
- Identification viewing for immediate family
- Transfer of the remains to Highland Park Cemetery if unclaimed
