Week 19 Highlights

The weekly Influenza Watch summarizes the flu surveillance in the City of Cleveland. The metrics in this report include the number and percentage of emergency department visits for influenza-like illness, confirmed hospitalizations for the flu, and the deaths each week due to pneumonia and influenza.

- For the 18th consecutive week, flu activity remains *Low*
- 5.1% of the 295 deaths reported were due to pneumonia. 1 influenza death were reported this week and there have been 7 influenza deaths so far this season.
- 7 confirmed cases of influenza-associated hospitalization were reported this week. 143 hospitalizations due to the flu were reported this season
- 1.81% of emergency department visits were for flu-like illness
- Influenza A remains the predominant strain. The vaccine remains a good match for the current circulating strain of Influenza A.



Influenza-Like Illnesses



The proportion of Emergency Room visits this reporting week for influenza-like illnesses remains under the *low* threshold and above to the 5-year average for MMWR Week 19. 50% of visits were male. Regarding race and ethnicity, 41% of visits were Black or African American individuals; 18% were among White individuals; and 41% of visits were among other racial groups 32% of visits. were among Hispanic or Latin individuals. The median age this week is 5 years.

The number of hospitalizations for influenza this week is higher than expected for this point of the flu season, but still below the *low* threshold. Influenza A is the predominant strain, which was observed among all of cases this week. This week there were 7 influenza-associated hospitalizations which brings the season total to 143.



There have been 16 deaths this week due to pneumonia or influenza-related illnesses (P&I). The proportion of P&I deaths is under the *low* threshold this week. This week, the data shows there was one influenza specific-related death. The majority P&I deaths that occurred this season were among individuals aged 45 years and older.
