

Previous Year (2016):

- 147 of those newly diagnosed cases are residents of Cleveland, Ohio
- 46 of the newly diagnosed cases were aged 25-29 years old

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Newly Diagnosed HIV Cases in Ohio and City of Cleveland

Newly diagnosed cases of HIV in Ohio have decreased throughout the 2017 year. The Ohio Department of Health (ODH) reported 1,019 newly diagnosed HIV cases within the state of Ohio for 2017. Additional testing and reporting has increased in previous years to allow for more data. Ohio Department of Health has reported 81% of the new diagnoses were male and 45% were black/African-American, with the rate of black/African-Americans being 6.7 times higher than that in whites. State data is provided by the Ohio Department of Health, Ohio HIV Summary 2017.

In the City of Cleveland newly diagnosed cases decreased from 2016. Cleveland Department of Public Health reports 158 newly diagnosed cases in Cuyahoga County in 2017. Of those newly diagnosed cases, 105 newly diagnosed cases were residents of Cleveland, Ohio at the time of diagnosis. 85% were males and 68% were black/African-Americans of the total newly diagnosed cases.


